RAIN GARDENS

...are small depressions that are planted with flowers and shrubs. They collect rainwater from driveways, sidewalks, or rooftops and help it seep into the ground. This filters water before it enters local streams and ponds.

The Boy Scouts have partnered with the Eastern CT Conservation District and other organizations to install 100 RAIN GARDENS and 100 RAIN BARRELS in Eastern Connecticut in 2018!

...are connected to gutter downspouts to catch rainwater from rooftops. This protects nearby streams, ponds, and wetlands by slowing down the rush of stormwater.
